Dear Mr. Sanfiord:

This is to advise that I worked a basket-ball game along with Mr. Casteel from East Bernstadt, Ky. on the night of December 4, between Livingston and Memorial High at Livingston, Ky.

During my years of officiating I have never heard a coach talk to an official like Mr. Sandlin from Memorial High talked to Mr. Casteel.

Here is the situation; We worked both games and during the first game, we told Mr. Sandlin two or three times not to get up off the bench and make fun of our calling, but he insisted to disagree with the majority of our calls. The score of this B team game ended 30-29 with Memorial High winning. All during the warm-up period, before the second game started, he would go from one to the other making wise cracks remarks about the officiation. The second game was just under way when Mr. Casteel called a personal foul on Memorial High and immediately Mr. Sandlin got off the bench and give Mr. Casteel the horse laugh and started making gu gustures with his hands, Casteel called a technical foul on him. The game went along very good for the remainder of the game Memorial High winning 58-4I.

After the game Mr. Sandlin came up to Casteel and said these words, (I think you are the worst damn official I have ever seen call a ball game)
All this happened in front of women and children, He went on to say to
Casteel, I got the worst damn Beal I have ever got anywhere. Your not worth

a damn in my opinion as an official.

Mr. Sandlin, went to the dressing room, I followed him in and asked him to come out and shake hands with Casteel and forget the whole thing, but he refused to do this. He then came out and started on Casteel again some of the team players tried to get Mr. Sandlin to go on to the bus but he still insisted of arguing. The boys on his team finally got him to go with him still griping. Casteel and I left as soon as we got our check and started to the car when we were passing the school bus with students and players setting in same they called him every thing they could think of and threatened him if they ever caught him out. There were I5 fouls called against Memorial High, and 20 fouls called against Livingston three of Livingston players fouled out and none from Memorial High.

Dear Mr. Sanford;

Mr. Sanford, this is to let you know that John Nunemaker and myself worked a basket-ball game at Livingston, Ky. between Livingston High and Memorial High. December 4,1951.

I would like to say that of the many games I have worked for a number of different high schools and colleges, I have never been treated as dirty by a coach as I was by the Memorial High School coach, also I have never seen a coach talk to an official as Mr. Talbert Sandlin did to me last night.

The situation is as follows; We officiated both games. During the first game Mr. Sandlin was up off the bench most all the first game saying nasty remarks, and rejecting most every call we would make. Three times I know of Mr. Sandlin walked half way down the court outside the playing floor disagreeing on calls made by John and Myself. We warned Mr. Sandlin of this but it didn't seem to help much. Memorial High won this game by a margine of 30-29, with two moore fouls called &gainst Livingston, than Memorial High. As soon as the game was ended Mr. Sandlin went to the scorers bench accusing the scorers of cheating him out of two points, when both scorers books tallied exactly. From there he went to Mr. Moore coach of Livingston High asking him if this was the best he could offer on officials.

When A teams was warming up before the **gext** game started, he was going from one to the other making cracks of how bad the officiating was. The second game started and was about two or three minutes old, when I called a personal foul on one of Memorial High players. Mr. Sandlin, raised up off his bench and give me the horse laugh, and then blowed his nose in the towel he was holding and said; Jesus Christ, loud enoughs most of the fans heard him, I called a techenical foul on him. From then through the rest of the game went by pretty smooth, but now and then he would disagree with our calls and give us the horse laugh.

The game ended 58-4I Memorial High winning. Twenty fouls were called on Livingston, and I5 fouls were called on Memorial High. John Nunemaker and I fouled out three of Livingston players and none was fouled offt for Memorial High.

As soon as this second game was over Mr. Sandlin went to Mr. Moore coach of Livingston Higher asking him if this was the best he could offer an officials.

Mr. Sandlin, then came to me demanding why I called the technical foul on him and started argueing and saying your the worst damn official that has ever called a ball-game for me and asked what my name was, I said; Ralph Casteel and tried to shake hands with him and forget the whole matter because there were a number of fans standing near, with (women and children) using foul slers I didn't approve of, but he kept on. I told him I was going to report this to you, and he said he didn't give a damn who I reported him to. He refused to shake hands with me and went off to the dressing roo m saying things I couldn't hear. As we were waiting to be paid he came back again and said; Youll never call another ball game for me and that he had plentys of friends that he would see to it I never call a ball game for. I said thats perfectly ok if he felt thes way

that I didn't wish to call any motore ball-games for a coach that has the attitude as he did toward a basket-ball game. His boys kept asking him to come on lets go home, but he kept on insisting to argue, finally one of the fans said, why don't you shut up, then he left talking to himself. After we received our pay we left the gym and on the way to the car we passed the school bus, and they kept throwing nasty remarks at me until John, and I got out of sight.

Mr . Sanford, I had hoped I would never have to report any-thing like this, but I have never seen anything like this during my eight years of playing basket ball, and my number of years officiating. If you wish for me to come to Henderson for a person to person talk, I will be more than glad to take off from my business at your request.

Memorial High School on Friday Night, December 4th. It was during the reserves basketball game that Carl Yahnig, a junior at Ferguson High School, and a forward on the varsity squad was standing near the main playing floor just above where the Ferguson boys were to dress. An outsider reported to be Billy Phillips, and living in the Memorial School District was standing near the water fountain. He called Carl Yahnig up to him, and without any provocation whatsoever hit him in the jaw and broke his jawbone. The doctor reports that Yahnig will be lost to the Ferguson Basketball for at least two months.

It was reliably reported that the deputy sheriff had apprehended this boy and ejected him from the building once before this that night, but they let him back into the building. Two of the Ferguson basketball players informs me that the Phillips boy was drinking. As far as I know the Phillips boy is atill at large.

Memorial High School (Waynesburg) Investigation December 9, 1959

Prin. Lawrence Hale of the Memorial High School read the letter from Supt. Howard Moore addressed to Commissioner Sanford and stated that the incident happened about as set forth in the letter.

Mr. Hale said that Deputy Sheriff Earl Simms had not put Billy Philipps out of the gym prior to the time he struck Carl Yahnig but had started to do so at some time during the first part of the first game but the boy had pleaded with him to let him go and that he would sit down up in the stands and remain quits.

Billy Phillips struck Yahnig in the jaw sometime during the half of the first game. It was near the end of this game before Mr. Hale and Simms found out who had hit Yahnig. The deputy took Phillips to the Ferguson dressing room for identification. It was between games when the deputy was taking the boy out of the building. There was a crowd milling around in the hall and Phillips jerked loose from the deputy and lost himself in the crowd. Simms was unable to locate the boy after that.

The next morning Mr. Hale and the Lincoln Co. Sheriff swore out a warrant for Phillips on various charges. The parents of Carl Yahnig swore out a warrant the same morning. The law officers were unable to serve the warrants as Phillips could not be located. It is most likely that he went to Ohio as he had only recently been employed there. His parents do not know his whereabouts at this time.

Billy Phillips is a former pupil at Memorial. He was in attendance a part of two semesters about four years ago and failed to make a passing grade in any subject. He has been in the Marines and has been working in Ohio since his release. So far as could be learned there had been no previous trouble between the two boys.

Mr. Hale had not reported the case as he learned only Tuesday that the Phillips had left the state. He hoped that he would be able to report that he had been arrested, but was planning to report the incident regardless.

Dear Sir:

In our basketball game with Ferguson High School on December 4, 1959; one of our fans, Billy Phillips, struck Carl Yahnig, a first team player for Ferguson High School. The blow fractured the boy's jaw. This took place about the time for the second half of the "B" game to begin. It happened somewhere near the entrance to the visitors dressing room. According to our information, Billy called the boy to him and hit him without any apparent reason. The boy did not fight back.

The deputy sheriff was here, and he had talked with Billy before this happened and had sent him in the stands to behave nimself--which Billy promised to do. I did not know the boy from Ferguson was hurt until the first team game was about over. He played about half of the game before he had to quit.

The sheriff arrested Billy and took him in the dressing room where Carl Yahnig was. Billy told Carl he was sorry he hit him; but when they cam back in the crowd, Billy got away from the sheriff and ran away. The sheriff got a warrant of arrest for him the following day, but didn't find him. He has not been arrested as yet.

Carl's parents came on Saturday and got a warrant for Billy. The sheriff said the warrant would last from now on. Carl has the school plan insurance at Ferguson High School.

We have been holding the Billy Phillips case open since last December when you wrote to us concerning the incident that happened at Waynesburg on the evening of December 4.

School authorities and officers of the law in Lincoln Count have been most cooperative in seeing to it that Billy Phillips was apprehended and brought to trial. As you may know, Billy apparently disappeared from the county soon after the incident involved, but the boy was finally induced to return home late in December and give himself up.

On February 9, 1260, Prin. Lawrence Hale of Memorial High School advised me that Billy's examining trial was held on January 7, and that he was held under \$1,500 bond to the February grand jury. We have been keeping in touch with Mr. Hale all along on this case. The trial was apparently set at a later date.

We have just received a letter from Mr. Hale which says: "Billy Phillips was tried on June 6, 1960. He was given thirty days in jail and a hundred dollar fine. He is now serving his jail sentence."

It is unfortunate that this case dragged on so long, but it appears that justice finally prevailed. I hope that Carl Yahnig has recovered from his injury.

You should talk to your principal about this matter. He is quite familiar with our regulations, I am sure. It is possible that you have already done this.

You state in your letter that you "started to school three weeks late and then missed twenty-two days."

If these twenty-two days were continuous, this would be more than four weeks of school, which added to the other three would amount to seven weeks. To be eligible any semester, a student must have been in attendance at least three school months of the immediately preceding semester. You apparently have not done this for the first semester of this school year.

I have no authority to set aside the penalty of the rule involved (K.H.S.A.A. By-Law 5-4).

In compliance with your request, we are sending information concerning the winners and runners-up in the 46th District Basketball Tournament which we find in our records.

You will note the information which we are sending you begins with the 1937 tournament. I am sorry that records are not currently available for the period prior to this, but the methods of reporting the tournaments to the State Office were somewhat inadequate during the early history of the Association. This is the best that we can do. It may be that some of the old-timers in your area can give you information concerning the earlier tournaments.

You will note that in the years 1943, 1944 and 1945 we have listed the districts as number 91 and number 92. The reason for this was that in those years the Association had 128 districts instead of 64. I can understand how the provisions By-Law 8 appear to be contradictory to statements made in item 52 of the Questions and Answers. However, By-Law 8 allows athletes involved in certain sports to play on outside teams during the season without loss of eligibility. Item 52 refers to a player who extends the season in a non-exempted sport by playing in a non-sanctioned post-season game.

Dear Mr. Sanford:

I am writing to you concerning the eligibility of one of our students, Julian L. Wall, for baseball competition. Let me first give you a brief background of the circumstances involved in this situation.

Two weeks after the state basketball tournament Julian was asked to play in an independent basketball tournament with a local team. Before agreeing to play he consulted one of our coaches who, indicated to him that his eligibility for baseball would not be in jeopardy if he participated in this tournament. These instructions were given only after consulting the "Constitution, By-Laws and Tournament Rules" bulletin of the K.H.S.A.A. This decision was based on By-Law 8, page 16. This rule seems to indicate very clearly that Julian's baseball eligibility would not be in question if he participated.

With this understanding Julian played three games of basketball in the tournament. After his eligibility was again questioned, Coach Hatter decided to call you in order to get a clarification of the rules. We then became aware of question and answer number 52 on page 75. This seems to be contradictory to the By-Law mentioned above.

Let me say that Julian is very deserving of any favorable consideration which you might give him. He has been a real competitor as well as a true sportsman while representing our school. If there has been a violation of the rules on Julian's part, I am sure that it was only because of the fact that he was not made aware of the rules.

At the present time Julian is being held out of action pending instructions from your office. It would certainly be appreciated if you could give us a ruling on Julian's status as soon as possible.
